## T-137 BUNKER UNDER PARKING LOT AT COOPER!

When I was in high school, I remember hearing a rumor about a bombproof shelter underground on the UW property at 19<sup>th</sup> Ave. S.W. and S.W. Genesee. My Mom and I speculated on what the underground shelter could have been used for – secret weapons storage, animal testing, prisoners? Now, thanks to neighbor Jim Sander's research skills, we know a little more. The underground room is the transmitter building (known as T-137) for the Alaska Communications System - West Seattle Transmitter Station. The ACS was set up to connect the territory of Alaska to the continental US. It also served a military function in that the short wave was used to relay direct radio to the Army in the Aleutians. T-137 was entirely underground, built in 1943 for over \$500,000. It is approximately 64' x 102' (around 7000 sq. feet). It has 2' thick cement floors, 4' thick walls and 9' thick, steel re-inforced roof, and not


