## GENESEE POND DREDGING AND MAINTENANCE

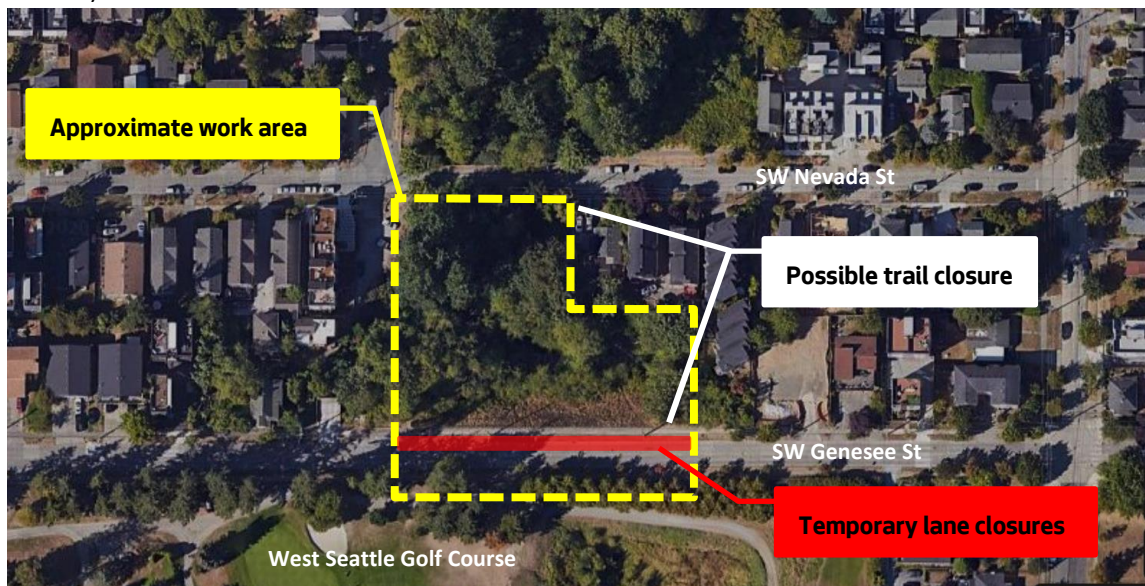
### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) will use heavy equipment, pump and bypass, machinery, and trucks to remove sediment and maintain SW Genesee Street Outfall (sometimes called Genesee Pond) on the north side of SW Genesee St between 26<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> Ave SW. Removing sediment (soil and material that has settled to the bottom) will improve how this drainage structure holds and moves water from rainstorms.

### SCHEDULE AND LOCATION

Work is expected to begin on or around July 20. We expect the repair work to take 2-3 weeks to complete. Work hours are Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

SW Genesee Street Outfall is on the north side of SW Genesee St (across from the West Seattle Golf Course) in the 2600 block.



### ANTICIPATED IMPACTS

- Temporary lane closures.
- Temporary parking restrictions.
- Possible temporary closures of Longfellow Creek Legacy Trail between SW Genesee St and SW Nevada St.
- Steel ramps running across SW Genesee St.
- Increased construction traffic, noise, dirt, and vibrations.
